What would convince you to leave your home to escape persecution? That was the question that confronted the German Jews in the late 1930's, as the anti-Semitic incidents and laws increased. What if you had fought for Germany in World War I, and you believed that Hitler would never incarcerate veterans of the German army?

Irma Pretsfelder's father ultimately made that agonizing decision, after temporary imprisonment in Buchenwald. Because of his courage, part of the family was saved.

Come to hear her first person account on Sunday morning. Together, we will observe Yom HaShoah, honoring the courage of the survivors, and honoring the memory of the victims.

Wendy and Patrick Drabinski welcome the Temple Adas Shalom community to join them and their family and friends for Shabbat services on Friday, May 3rd and Saturday, May 4th as their daughter, Naomi Lynn, becomes a Bat Mitzvah.

Naomi is the younger sister to 14 year old Rayna and is a caring sister to our two Maltese dogs, Rose and Tulip. She is a 7th grade honor roll student at Bel Air Middle School, who is an avid reader, loves listening to music, visiting amusement parks, watching You Tube videos, and going on vacations to the beach and tropical islands. She enjoys attending Camp Louise, a Jewish sleepaway camp in the Summer, as well as Camp Spencer, a Y camp, where she goes horseback riding, swimming, and practices archery. She has been playing the euphonium (a small tuba) since she was in the 4th grade. She is also a black belt in Taekwondo. Naomi is working on her Silver Award for Girl Scouts and joined Girl Scouts as a Daisy. Naomi loves adventure, whether it's zip lining through the rain forest or riding the surfing simulator on a cruise ship.

Naomi started at Temple Adas Shalom as a shul baby in a car seat attending Friday night services and started Sunday School in Randi Chancey's Pre-K class. She won the 2017 Eileen Moss Memorial Award. She is a well-rounded member of the Harford Jewish Center family and has been at many havdalah services, Daven and Dines, shiva houses, and many other HJC functions. She has even attended the start of several board meetings while waiting for her dad to pick her up on his way home from work. Our temple family is like a second family to us, and the congregants have taken Naomi in as one of their own since she was an infant.

The requirements to become a Bat Mitzvah include participation in the Tri-Mitzvahlon, a series of projects that allows Naomi to fulfill her service to her community, her congregation, and to the twinning project. Naomi's community service project focuses on a group of persecuted Ethiopian Jews

who would like to learn Hebrew. She is creating wall hangings with the Hebrew alphabet along with flash cards with sayings in Hebrew and Amharic (the native language of Ethiopia) to help the children learn Hebrew. She is also putting Hebrew phrases on t-shirts for the children and making blankets for the community. She has learned to use an embroidery software on a sewing machine and a t-shirt press while working on this project. A member of Naomi's Girl Scout troop is working on the project with her as part of their Silver Award. We invite you to join in this project by tying knots in some blankets to finish them. The blankets will be in the Social Hall during the Friday night oneg.

For Naomi's service to the temple, she helped switch over the High Holiday books for several years and also worked in the temple garden. For the third part of her Tri-Mitzvahlon, Naomi is twinning with her grandmother, Joan Karlin, who never became a Bat Mitzvah. When Joan was growing up in Brooklyn, girls did not have a ceremony to become Bat Mitzvah. Her grandma Joan would be so proud of Naomi today and so happy to become a Bat Mitzvah.

The Drabinski family would like to express our gratitude to all the leaders and teachers at Temple Adas Shalom. Naomi's teachers helped her prepare not only to become a Bat Mitzvah, but to be a service leader as well as a leader and individual thinker in life.

Thank you to Rabbi Gila Ruskin for her spiritual guidance, problem solving skills, and helping Naomi with her Torah Karaoke and drash. Thank you to Linda Needel for her amazing tutoring skills, her sweet dogs, and the beautiful tallit clips. Thank you to Dr. Paul Ruskin for all of his help with Naomi's Torah Karaoke. Thank you to Eliana Joslin, her teen tutor, for helping Naomi with the service prayers. Thank you to the choir and Mike Mullis for bringing beautiful music to the Friday night service. Thank you to the 7th grade families for the relationships that have flourished over the years to make the temple a second home.

She has a sweet spot in her heart for children and knows that books can be a comfort to someone to take them to a different place in their mind than where they are right now. The children in the hospital may be very scared and she hopes that her gift can bring joy to them. For her twinning portion of the tri-mitzvahlon project, Sammie chose to twin with a Jewish boy who was unable to have a Bar Mitzvah ceremony due to circumstances surrounding the Holocaust. 2019 Proposed Bylaws

Every few years, it becomes time to review our congregational bylaws and make sure they reflect the needs of the congregation and enable our Board to better manage Temple Adas Shalom operations and governance. The bylaws were last amended in May 2014. We formed a committee to research topics for changes to bylaws, taking into account best practices from other congregations, the URJ Yammer/Tent discussion board and discussions with many congregants. The committee now puts forward the following amendments for vote at the May 2019 congregational meeting. Ratification requires a majority vote from a total vote tally of at least 25% of the total membership in good standing. You may prefer to complete the ballot at the end of this article and turn it in with your name, signature and date.

Amendment 1: Changing the bylaws to reflect the name “Temple Adas Shalom” (I.1)

- Current Language: This organization shall be known as the Harford Jewish Center, Inc., trading as Temple Adas Shalom-Harford Jewish Center, hereinafter, TAS-HJC.
- Proposed TAS Text: This organization, incorporated in December 1955 as the Harford Jewish Center, Inc., shall be known as Temple Adas Shalom, (TAS.)
- Discussion
 - This would simplify the name of our congregation and lead to common branding. Our congregation represents more than just Harford County, Maryland.
 - We may lose touch with congregational history.

Amendment 2: Allow for Non Jewish Membership (III.1)

- Current Language: Jews, Jewish families, or any person seeking to convert to Judaism by way of study approved by a Rabbi shall be eligible for membership in the congregation
- Proposed TAS Text: Individuals or families who seek to be united by Jewish values and a commitment to the Jewish people
- Discussion

- This would make TAS more inclusive and welcoming, especially to non-Jewish spouses and families
- This could move TAS away from Jewish roots

Amendment 3: Voting Rights, General (III.7)

- Current Language: Each family unit has one vote. This must be cast by an adult Jewish member of the family
- Proposed TAS Text: Each family membership unit has one vote per adult, with a maximum of two votes per family
- Discussion
 - If the amendment for non-Jewish individual membership passes, this should change to correspond with the value of membership. This gives voting empowerment to families – it does not combine votes across a family couple. It does not affect votes in the URJ, which counts by households
 - This could add voting complexity

Amendment 4: Voting Rights, Board (V.2 and V.4)

- Current Language:
 - (V.2) Holding of a voting Board of Trustees position is limited to Jewish members of the Congregation.
 - (V.4) All trustees must be Jewish members in good standing with TAS-HJC
- Proposed TAS Text:
 - (V.1) Non Jewish members are permitted for the following board positions: Emeritus; Tikkun Olum/Social Action; Preschool/Early Learning Center, Buildings and Grounds, Technology.
 - (V.2) Holding of a voting Board of Trustees position is limited to members of the Congregation
 - (V.4) All trustees must be members in good standing with TAS
- Discussion
 - This would make TAS more inclusive and welcoming, especially to non-Jewish spouses and families. It capitalizes on potential for increased participation and innovation

- Does Preschool (ELC) need to stay Jewish? This could move TAS away from Jewish roots

Amendment 5: Fund Raising Committee (VIII.6)

- Current Language: Fund Raising - The duties of the Fundraising Trustees shall be (a) to plan and conduct all regular or special social and fund raising events including holiday dinners, meetings, special events, and other religious and special occasions, (b) to coordinate the social and fund raising events with the President and other Board of Trustees members, as appropriate. All funds raised by these activities shall be turned over to the Treasurer. The Fundraising Trustees shall be responsible for ensuring the accurate completion of all building use contracts for social and fundraising events.
- Proposed TAS Text:
 - Social Committee - The duties of the Social Committee shall be (a) to plan and conduct all regular or special social activities, including picnics, parties, etc., (b) to plan for refreshments at social affairs and meetings, including dinners at installations, meetings, and other special occasions, (c) to coordinate the social events calendar with the President of TAS-HJC and the President of Sisterhood and (d) to introduce new members at meetings and socials.
 - Fund Raising - The duties of the Fund Raising Committee shall be to formulate plans for raising extraordinary funds (other than those specified elsewhere in this Constitution), to execute these plans and turn the funds raised over to the Treasurer.
- Discussion
 - These functions were combined during the 2014 bylaws revision, but have become too much work and responsibility to remain effective
 - We already have no volunteers for some fundraisers – does this make it more difficult?

Amendment 6: Structure of the Board (VIII.1)

- Current Language: There shall be a Board of Trustees which shall consist of the officers of the organization as defined in ARTICLE IV, Sec. 1, plus the Immediate Past President, the President of Sisterhood, the Chair of the Religious Practices Committee, the Chair of the Religious School Committee, the Chair of the Social Action/Tikkun Olan Committee, the Chair of the Building and Grounds Committee, and eight (8) elected Trustees, two of whom shall be declared Emeritus. The Immediate Past President shall remain a member of the Board of Trustees until his/her successor is replaced. The Rabbi shall serve as an advisor to the Board of Trustees.
- Proposed TAS Text:
 - Reduction of Emeritus to one position. Reduction of Adult Education to one position. If amendment 5 passes, increase of two positions for Social.
- Discussion
 - Board positions are exceedingly more difficult to fill because there are not enough volunteers

Other minor changes

- Proposed TAS Text
 - (III-4) Current members shall be considered renewing membership each year subject to good standing or member notification of desired change to status.
 - (IV-1) Sharing of officer/board positions by two members shall be permitted, however, only one vote shall be cast.
 - (V-1) Rename Preschool Committee to Early Learning Center Committee.
- Rationale
 - (III-4) Current practice, reduces the burden of annual membership renewal forms.
 - (IV-1) Current practice
 - (V-1) Meets Maryland State law definitions
