As was announced at the Congregational Board Meeting on Sunday, Rabbi Bailey Romano was offered a contract for a full time position after the strong recommendation of both the Search Team and the Board of Trustees. We were among several congregations extending offers, and unfortunately, she has accepted an offer from another congregation.

We have followed up with Rabbi Cindy Enger, Director of Rabbinic Placement at the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR), discussing several possible options. These include considering other Rabbis who may be a good fit, a student Rabbi, an interim Rabbi, and/or extending Rabbi Gila's contract either through the HHs or December (as she has offered). In any scenario, the Search Team and the Board of Trustees will be involved, and will keep you up to date as key events occur.

Security Committee Update

The team - Fred Edeson, Rich Foard, Paula Mullis, Jonas Vogelhut, Fred Wood, Elise Woods and Pat Wolkow - began meeting in March to sketch out a holistic plan for our security. We discussed our individual talents and interests, and noted that we needed to prepare for the upcoming FEMA Grant process. We have successfully refined our responses for that, and submitted our application for the \$100,000 grant award in May. We will learn of the result in early September.

Our next focus will be on how we can better prepare ourselves when the physical barriers (“hardening”) we have put in place do not deter danger. Be on the lookout for training sessions and new measures that we can implement, to be as prepared as possible.

Today was the last day of Religious School. It's my second favorite day of the school year. The first day is my favorite, when friends see each other after the long summer, and there's so much potential for the year ahead of us.

We gather together on Sunday mornings in our classrooms, the student lounge, the new art room, the refurbished sanctuary and social hall. Our students learn about holidays, Hebrew and prayers. They learn about being Jewish and about being a part of a Jewish community. Over the course of the year each class has led the congregation in prayer, standing proudly on the Bima in front of their families and TAS members. The confirmands service will be June 7th. This is truly the best grade level service of the year.



But back to today. Today following the Maccabi games we gathered for the awards. We started with the Eileen Moss Award, awarded to a sixth-grade student who has shown exemplary attendance in religious school and services and improvement in Hebrew skills throughout their midweek years. All of the sixth grade students have shown great improvement from the time they were in Miss Rosalyn's classroom until they led the Saturday morning service on May 18th. The recipient is chosen by a vote of their former teachers and their classmates. This year's winner

was Jack Baker. Congratulations Jack!

The second award is the Yvette Kravitz award – For contributions above and beyond on behalf of the Religious School. This year the award went to Rabbi Gila. She has brought so much to every part of the Religious School since she arrived here 10 years ago. Like Yvette Kravitz, Rabbi Gila made a difference at Temple Adas Shalom. We also gave her a beautiful gift: a tree where the fingerprints of students and teachers make the leaves. It was a great day.

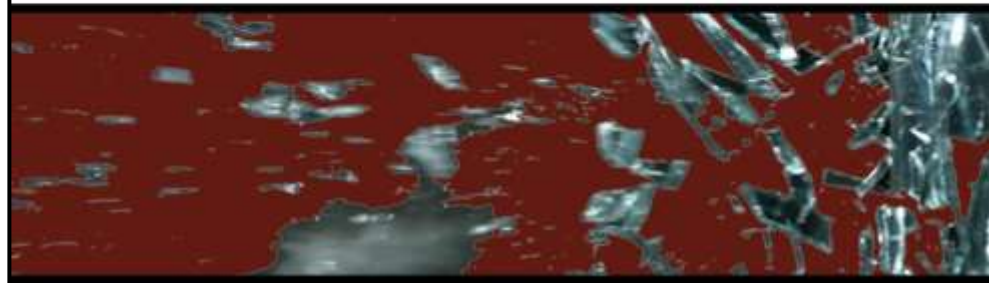

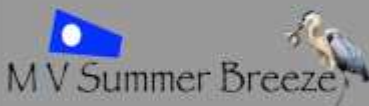
